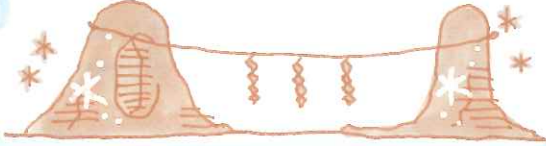


There are more special sights besides Miho Jinja and Mihonoseki Lighthouse.

**Wedded Rocks**

These are two large rocks in the water along the national highway that leads from Matsue into Mihonoseki. They are said to be a well-matched couple blessed with a child.



**Bukkoku-ji Temple**

This temple is on the map. It was built to mourn the earnest love of Yaoya O-Shichi, who died a sad death separated from her lover, and Kichiza, who made a pilgrimage all over Japan for her sake.



**Jizo Cape**

Mihonoseki Lighthouse is at the tip of Jizo Cape. On a clear day, you can see Mt. Daisen and the Oki Islands across the sea!

Daikoku, the deity of matchmaking shrine Izumo Taisha, and Ebisu, the deity of commerce shrine Miho Jinja, are father and son. It has long been said that visiting Izumo Taisha and Miho Jinja holds the same power as visiting Ise Jingu Grand Shrine.
